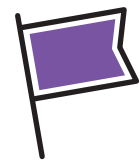
WHO WE ARE

We have moved into our recovery and reopening process while continuing to keep our program participants and our staff safe. Our Early Learning Centers reopened with reduced attendance almost a year ago, and we are optimistic we will bring more of our distance learning students back into the classroom this Fall. We have also reopened our main San Mateo office for Financial Empowerment and Older Adult Services staff to return.

We do anticipate that recovery will be slow and difficult for many in our community, in particular as a result of the emergence of new variants. With your help and the dedication of our staff, PFS will continue to stand strong. Due to the incredible generosity of our supporters, we are pleased to report that PFS delivered much needed support to those most in need throughout the pandemic. We closed our fiscal year 2020-2021 in a strong financial position enabling us to provide high-quality services across our programs in a safe manner. As a result of your generous contributions, we also distributed over \$1 million

in direct support to those most affected. In this Annual Report you will see many personal stories of those whose lives have been greatly impacted by your generosity.

We are dedicated to building our community where everyone can thrive with opportunity, financial stability, and wellness. We will continue our high-quality programs as well as undertake new initiatives including building our next 4-year strategic plan, moving toward a new project at our Midway Early Learning Center, and much more.

We are very grateful and humbled by the tremendous generosity and support you have provided to your community through PFS. Your impact on those most in need has truly been life changing for many. Thank you for all you do and for your support.

THE HEART of our COMMUNITY

One private family foundation has been deeply moved by the challenges our community members are facing and has offered grants of up to \$5,000 to those individuals or families in need of more help. Peninsula Family Service (PFS) facilitates the applications for these “Guardian Angel Grants.” To date, 112 grants of \$5,000 each have been made to individuals and families for a total of \$560,000! After receiving their check, one family stated: “My family and I reiterate our gratitude to you for all that you do for us. It’s really a big thumbs up in our modest family who will eventually be able to pay a few months of rent with this big check that we have just received from the foundation.” PFS is honored to collaborate in this life-changing grant process. Another recipient noted: “I am absolutely astounded by the support, and it renewed my faith in humanity.”

Inspired by the Guardian Angel program, a generous couple contributed \$60,000 for “Community Lift Grants” distributed by PFS in \$1,200 checks to 50 families. This act of kindness has allowed some of our participants to pay their rent or their vehicle loan—something they otherwise would be unable to do because of the pandemic. This outpouring of support has enabled our community members to endure the many challenges caused by COVID-19.

EARLY LEARNING

ENDINGS *and* BEGINNINGS

During the past 18 months, children and their families encountered trauma and change with resiliency and courage. One constant throughout is the power of caring within safe learning environments, made possible by Peninsula Family Service (PFS) educators supported by local donors. An innovation PFS has recently undertaken is the creation of our Safe Daily School Learning Hub classrooms at our Leo J. Ryan (LJR) site. Three classrooms were established early during COVID-19 where our school-age children could study and work virtually with their remote classroom teachers and schoolmates, allowing their parents to go to work. For many children, coming back to LJR meant returning to their “home away from home.” This past year, even more students were served through the support of a generous donor who made it possible to open a fourth Learning Hub at LJR. In collaboration with South San Francisco School District and Sunshine Gardens Elementary School, these learning hubs were a tremendous success.

It is clear that distance learning has taken its toll on the children, their families, and the school community. It is equally apparent that being able to attend online sessions from LJR helped the children with their academic work and supported them to heal emotionally. Our children adapted to ever changing circumstances with courage, and the shifts in their daily life both at home and at school became more manageable.

The Bohannon Family Foundation provided support for our Midway Early Learning Center to reopen with new outdoor tables and chairs to maximize outdoor time. Judy and Erica Swanson, our lead funders, and others, made *STEM from the Start* activities possible. Students continue to talk with confidence about becoming scientists, teachers, and computer programmers. Through it all, their hopes and dreams are well and alive.

The 2020-2021 school year ended as our children signed off online classes and parted with backpacks and hopes for an enjoyable summer. Strong resources, follow-through, caring relationships, and social-emotional environments continue to be protective factors in supporting our children. Excitement emerged as distance learning shifted to in-person summer camp and hands-on learning, converting our classrooms to summer camp fun.

Henry enjoyed his customer service role at a local community center before COVID-19. He was one of the welcoming faces who greeted city residents as they entered the main lobby. Henry found joy in explaining program options to customers, answering their questions with poise and attentiveness, as well as registering them for valuable recreation and continued learning classes. Then COVID-19 abruptly interrupted Henry’s employment.

Being a resourceful professional, Henry enrolled with the NOVA Job Center in Sunnyvale and learned about the Mature Worker Job Coaching Program, a part of the Peninsula Family Service (PFS) Second Careers Program funded by Santa Clara County. He was relieved and grateful that he could participate in a program customized to the age 50+ job seeker.

Henry participated in customized job search coaching from the Mature Worker Program adviser, workshops, and group discussion sessions. He learned about writing an age-neutral resume, interviewing strategies in a multigenerational workforce, and the importance of networking with others. Henry embraced networking as a key strategy, and he kept in touch with his previous supervisor as the COVID-19 pandemic unfolded. He discovered that the community center needed help with transitioning some of its classes

to a remote environment. While demonstrating his “can do” attitude in conversations with his previous supervisor, she invited him to pilot a remote class as the facilitator. Henry willingly adapted to new technology platforms and ran a very effective remote class. It wasn’t long before he landed a new job with the organization. Despite the impact of COVID-19, this job seeker is thriving!

Reflecting upon his participation in the Mature Worker Job Coaching Program, Henry gratefully shared that “it is a very valuable program for the ‘older’ segment of workers!”

FUNDERS SUPPORT FINANCIAL EMPOWERMENT

In addition, Sutter Health Mills-Peninsula Medical Center provided a generous grant to support *DriveForward* in providing low-cost vehicle loans. With the emergence of COVID-19, the Financial Empowerment team pivoted to help participants who experienced income loss maintain their vehicles by deferring car loan payments as well as supporting families to obtain emergency financial support, rental relief, and utility bill waivers. Meanwhile the California Department of Financial Protection & Innovation supported our financial education work which converted to online classes and financial counseling. The flexibility of our funders was incredible and on behalf of the many people we serve, we are so grateful.

OLDER ADULT SERVICES

LEARNING TECHNOLOGY SKILLS *to be* CONNECTED

Prior to COVID-19 Juan and Sofia were active participants at the Fair Oaks Adult Activity Center for years. In late 2018, Sofia noticed a health decline in Juan, which led to a diagnosis of Alzheimer's. With the help of Peninsula Family Service (PFS) staff, Sofia found several referrals to resources and financial assistance to assist with Juan's daily needs. Unfortunately, just as they began to have a sense of normalcy and routine, COVID-19 forced the Fair Oaks Adult Activity Center to close.

Sofia was not technologically savvy and did not have the finances to purchase a tablet or laptop to communicate with the outside world. She felt isolated, lonely, and overwhelmed.

Thanks to funding from Sequoia Healthcare District and San Mateo County Behavioral Health and Recovery Services, PFS provided Wi-Fi-enabled tablets and trained many older adult participants to use this valuable tool. Thus began the “*Get Connected*” program to use technology to provide the human connection that Sofia and so many of our older adults need. This program creates a foundation of technology knowledge to enhance other vitally important PFS older adult services programs such as *Senior Peer Counseling* and *Get Appy* workshops, a part of the *Help@Hand* program.

Sofia was a perfect candidate for this new valuable program. She needed help and she knew that the only way to “*Get Connected*” with family members, friends, activities, and resources would be through technology. She signed up for the outdoor training at the Fair Oaks garden, and additional training through ANewVista.

With Sofia's new skills, she and Juan are able to utilize technology in multiple ways. They participate in virtual recreational activities including chair yoga and attend webinars that interest them with topics such as nutrition. They are now able to use technology to connect with family and access the internet safely. Sofia has found resources to care for herself and Juan, and now feels supported and informed.

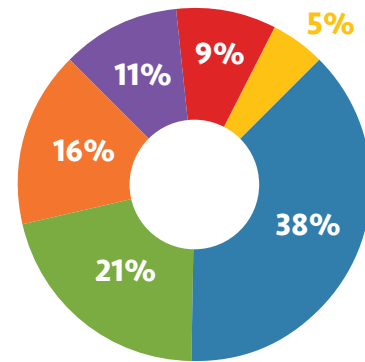

PROGRAM REVENUE

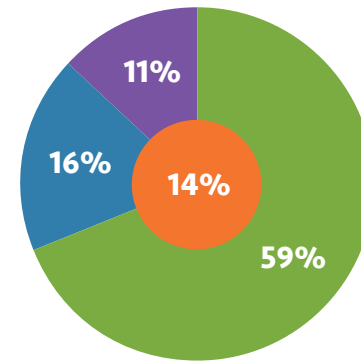
